CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by President Debbie Arnold at 9:13 a.m. followed by introduction of directors, staff, focus groups and guests.

PRESENTATIONS

Two evacuation systems that are used in disaster preparedness for modeling evacuations, Ladris and Genasys, were presented by Greg Alex. The programs have great features: Forecasting impact zones, visualization of evacuation plans, identifying problems with evacuation areas/routes, and determining one way egress communities. SLO FSC has one more year of funding slated for the programs to assist SLO County OES.

Dan Turner, Executive Director, presented two projects that SLO FSC is funding – Fireshed and PIRS. SLO FSC has contracted with Rincon Consulting for Fireshed planning units and dashboard for SLO County. Fireshed is a large area where social and ecological concerns about wildfire combine and intertwine. Fire indiscriminately crosses property boundaries, requiring collaboration by landowners and managers to address challenges. The Fireshed planning units and dashboard will reduce the risk of wildfire to people, communities, recreation areas, and natural resources through coordinated land management. Projected completion date is March 31, 2024.

City of Atascadero is working with Cal Poly on the Plan Integration for Resilience Scorecard (PIRS). This method guides communities through the process of assessing and aligning their plans to maximize investments and reduce potential disaster impacts. It helps create proactive mitigation policies that work to reduce risk and create safer, more disaster-resilient communities.
