- 1. Awarded \$6.7 million; grant period ends 2030
- 2. Partners with Hearst Ranch, Covell Ranch, Cambria CSD Fiscalini Ranch; Friends of Fiscalini Ranch
- 3. Contract pending, discussions ongoing with grantor on last minute budget adjustments
- 4. Engaged Auten Resource Consulting for onsite Registered Professional Forester project management
- 5. Collaborative with RCD grant and CA State Parks projects in North Coast
- 6. Partner kick off meeting week of Oct 7

7.2 2023-24 CCI-CAL FIRE Wildfire Prevention Grants \$2,997,344 awarded

- A. Modifications needed due to overlap with Forest Health grant award funding for work on Covell Ranch (\$600,000)
- B. Projects previously identified may receive funding if our request for redirection of funds is approved. These projects include:
 - 1. Cambria CSD lot clearance add funding for an additional year (\$150,000)
 - 2. Atascadero projects (fund all requested in original proposal) (\$300,000)
 - 3. VMP Support (\$50,000)
 - 4. Increase in French broom removal and community chipping (\$50,000)
 - 5. Add additional year to Strawberry Canyon grazing funding (\$50,000)

7.3 2021 SLO County Hazard Fuel Reduction Grant (5GA20115) EXTENSION REQUEST

A. NO EXTENSION IS ALLOWED-grant expires 3/15/2025

- 1. This project is a partnership with City of SLO, Cal Poly and Miossi La Cuesta Ranch (private)
- 2. Cal VTP Project Specific Analysis (PSA) environmental document still under review by CAL FIRE and will not be approved in time to complete project
- 3. Current action: Re-scoping grant to swap projects (Miossi) with a different grant that has a longer performance period (5GA21137)
 - a. Parkhill VMP projects move to expiring grant (5GA20115)
 - Work can be accomplished by end of 2024 if CAL FIRE GRANTS approves redirect and CAL FIRE-SLU assists in implementation and expedites Miossi Cal VTP approval to allow Miossi Phase 1 to become operational
 - c. Miossi Phase 1 moved to replace Parkhill VMP projects in grant 5GA21137
